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From the Director (Mr. Craig Barrett)

Program Compliance

In the past 18 months we have conducted 30 Program Compliance Reviews (PCRs). This exceeds the total of the 3 previous Fiscal Years combined. Some states and territories have excelled, most have done well, and several have had significant issues.

I direct each PCR Team to be professional, fair, and comprehensive as they conduct the PCR. The intent is to ensure that all parties are operating correctly, efficiently, and effectively. If a state or territory is non-compliant then the PCR Team will detail the problems, help author a Corrective Action Plan, and train and assist as necessary.

We appreciate your cooperation with this process. We have suspended states; but, overall, the errors are being corrected and the program is operating more efficiently and effectively each month. It is imperative that this program not have significant incidents that could threaten its existence.

Property Accountability

We are continuing to reconcile a severely neglected property book. Again, some states and territories have excellent property accountability, most have a good handle on it and several have significant issues.

In FY 10 we required a 100% physical inventory by each LEA of their Weapons, Aircraft, Watercraft, and Tactical Vehicles along with a digital photo of the front, side, and serial number are of each Aircraft, Watercraft, and Tactical Vehicle. For the past 90 days my staff has been reviewing and reconciling these records.

Understand, it is a DOD requirement to conduct a 100% physical inventory of all Controlled Property (Demil B, C, D, E, F, Q3) each year. This is the requirement for FY 11.

If you have not begun your physical inventory, please do so. Each LEA should have the personnel to conduct this physical inventory. The more property an LEA has we assume the more officers

it supports and therefore the more officers available to draw from to conduct inventories and maintain property accountability. Property accountability is a responsibility of participating in the program. Failure to properly account for property will result in suspension and may result in program termination.

Again, the program is too valuable to be threatened by non-compliant LEAs or LEAs that do not maintain property accountability.

11th Annual Conference

Understand, that the program continues to grow and evolve.... requests for property are up 37.4% over 1 year ago and up 41.9% in the past 90 days. Processes and procedures continue to be refined.

So, it is imperative that you attend the National Conference where we will provide training and assistance to you. This year we will visit a Disposition Site. Keep up the good work and we plan for San Antonio.

New Appointment Letters Required for States with Newly Elected Governors


Due to the result of recent elections, some states have elected a new Governor. The new Governor-elects are scheduled to start their duties on January 1, 2011. For all states that have elected a new Governor, LESO will require that a new State Coordinator Appointment Letter be signed by the new

Governor and sent in to LESO no later than March 31, 2011.

If more time is required, contact your LESO Regional Team Lead to make arrangements. Any newly appointed State Coordinator who plans on appointing a State or Point of Contact (SPOC) to help manage their program

must complete an appointment letter and forward it to LESO. More than one SPOC may be appointed for each state. This does not apply if a Governor was re-elected.

LESO Contacting LEAs for Updated Information

LESO is in the process of contacting all Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) whose application is older than 1 year. It is imperative that LESO have the most up to date contact information for all LEAs participating in the 1033 Program.

Starting with the state of Alaska, all LEAs who have not completed an update

within the Calendar Year (CY) 2010 will be contacted in an attempt to update their enrollment information. All updated LEA applications will be sent to LESO through their State Coordinators. This action will identify to LESO what LEAs want to continue their participation within the 1033 Program and also identify those LEAs that no longer wish

to participate. State Coordinators will be notified prior to LEAs within their state being contacted. If you have any questions regarding this matter, please contact the LESO.

New Templates Mandatory January 1, 2011

The new LESO templates will be mandatory starting January 1, 2011. They have been posted on the LESO website. updated version available to your customers.

A recent change was made to the Application for Participation. We have added an area to put in a mailing address (P.O. Box). An LEA must still put a physical address (no P.O. Box) on the application; however, they may also add a mailing address, such as a P.O. Box, if applicable.

We have a work order in with IT support to add the mailing address to LEEDS. This will allow State Coordinators to send out mailings without having to do much research. Thank you Arkansas for this suggestion!

Currently LESO has approximately 30,000 weapons available for Law Enforcement Agencies. The current type and allocation limits as of January, 2011, are:

-System: M-16, Allocation: 100% per LEA strength

-System: M-14, Allocation: 50% per LEA strength

-System: 1911 .45 Caliber Pistols, Allocation: 100% per LEA strength

LESO is continuing to work with USTACOM to make additional weapon systems available for Law Enforcement Agencies.

The Gretna Police Department, LA received a Patrol Boat through the 1033 Program from DLA Disposition Services Texarkana in 2009. The boat is a 28 foot long M2 Military Bridge Boat, with twin 240 horse power Cummings diesel engines and dual 8 inch jet drives. It has been outfitted with radar, sonar and GPS and uses both VHF marine and 900 mega hertz police ban radio systems for communication. It has the capacity to hold up to 10 people in a rescue situation when manned by a 2 man crew.

During the BP Oil spill in

the summer and early fall of 2010, the boat was utilized to assist the Jefferson Parish Sheriff's Office, the City of Lafitte Police Department and the City of Grand Isle Police Department with the security of coastal oil diversion systems such as oil boom, suction devices and absorption material as well as any rescue operations or police action which may have needed resolution during this disaster. The boat was continuously manned by a 2 man crew and was in operation for 24 hours a day, 7 days a week during this operation which lasted approximately four and a

half months. The boat crew also assisted with animal rescue, emergency medical assistance/response, and they maintained a safe maritime environment for other vessels on the water.

Agencies in need of a watercraft should set up a Want List using Federal Supply Class (FSC) 1940. Special thanks to Mr. Thomas Jordan, the LA State Coordinator for sharing this success story.

Tactical Vehicle Team (Ms. Cassie Madden and Ms. Deb Smith)

As many of you may have noticed, many HMMWVs (Truck, Utility) have entered the LESO Property Search in the past few months. This influx of HMMWVs is due to the Army's decision to turn in the 6.2 L Models of the HMMWV.

What does this mean for LESO? There are a lot of opportunities to get a HMMWV for your agency. Make sure to set up a want list! Training for setting up a want list can be found on the LESO Homepage under the Training and Assistance Tab. The best way to find HMMWVs that are on the

inventory is to search for Truck, Utility in the Item Name field. Look for the items listed as Demil C.

Since October 1, 2010 there has been approximately 65 HMMWVs issued to LEAs across the United States with a total acquisition value of \$2,027,004.

LESO Customers have 14 days to pick up property they have been awarded. There are still approximately 15 of the 65 HMMWVs that have not been picked up. After this 14 day period, the DLA Disposition Site has the authority to request the

requisition is cancelled. If you are unable to pick up during the 14 days, we advise you to keep in contact with the DLA Disposition Site. The will normally work with you if they feel you are making an effort to pick up the property.

While there is no longer a priority listing for HMMWVs, the Vehicle Team is keeping track of LEAs that are issued one. We believe everyone that requests one should have one and want to make sure that happens!

1033 Program Success Story

Potterville Police Department (Potterville, Michigan)

The Potterville Police Department is one of the newest success stories for the 1033 Program. In October 2010, they requisitioned a HMMWV from Ft. Drum in upstate New York. It has an acquisition value of \$47k, but only set the police department back the cost of transportation to pick it up.

Chief Jones told Potterville's local paper, *The County Journal*, "It's not a vehicle we're going

to drive around all day, but it can get to places other vehicles can't."

Chief Jones will also be using the 1033 Program to find parts and tools to help with the upkeep of the vehicle. He is taking full advantage of the 1033 Program and all it offers and this HMMWV is just the start. He has also requisitioned computers, tire machines, and hand tools through the program and is helping stretch his community's budget a little

farther.
